Qualification Overview

The Level 3 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) for England provides the learner with the knowledge and understanding and skills relating to the health and social care workforce.

The qualification covers a wide range of areas including the role of the health and social care worker, equality, diversity and inclusion, duty of care and safeguarding and protection in health and social care. It also contains specific units related to the following pathways, Generic, Adults with Learning Disabilities or Dementia.

Qualification Structure

To achieve the Level 3 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) England learners must achieve a minimum of 58 credits, 28 credits from mandatory units, at least 23 credits from group optional units and a maximum of 7 credits from group specialist units. By achieving specific units in optional and specialist units, learners can claim one of the following endorsed pathways; Dementia or Adults with Learning Disabilities pathway.
